Acrylic Painting Materials List:

- Water cup (this doesn't need to be fancy. Any recycled plastic container will do)
- Pencil for quick sketches
- Bristol Board Pad or canvas paper pad. 16" x 20" is a good size
- Ruler
- Eraser
- Acrylic Paint:
Titanium White, Cadmium Red, Alizarin Crimson, Cadmium Yellow, Cobalt Blue, Ultramarine Blue, Burnt Umber, Phthalo Green, and Payne's Gray – Don't worry about a black, we'll learn how to make our own!
Purchase whatever your budget will allow but a non-student grade paint will serve you better in the long run.
- Paint brushes – small set with a variety of sizes – Stick with rounds and flats (you can get any type but synthetic bristles will hold up better with acrylics)
- Medium flexible metal Palette knife
- Palette (can be glass, plastic, or palette paper – flat surface – not the kind with cups for paint to sit in)
- Rags (old t-shirts work well)
- Small Spray Bottle
- Hand Soap – liquid not bar (can share)
- Toolbox to hold all supplies
- Apron or shirt to wear while painting
- Supports for your paintings – this can be the Bristol board or canvas paper, canvas boards, or canvas. You may want to start out with paper and then move on to canvas as you feel ready. I do recommend using canvas or canvas boards for at least one of your paintings in this class. These can be purchased in small packs. No smaller than 16" x 20"
