ABOUT THE ARTSCHOOL

The ArtSchool offers a diverse range of art classes to adults of all ages. The oldest program of the ArtsCenter, the ArtSchool has provided year-round community arts education to Triangle residents for fifty years. Professional artists provide quality arts instruction in subjects as varied as ceramics, drawing and painting, photography, jewelry and glass, theatre, writing, dance, and more on a quarterly schedule.

Need-based scholarships are given out on a rolling basis. You can request a 50%, 75%, or 100% scholarship. Please fill out and submit the online application on the ArtSchool page of our website. Students are eligible to receive up to 2 scholarships per year and may apply once per quarter. Priority is given to applicants who have not previously been awarded a scholarship.

We will start from simple studies to more complex compositions. This class, given in person, is for all levels, and no prior drawing skills are required, but developing a personal style will be encouraged. For technical accuracy, we will use graphite pencils only, and at the end, we will carry out a final project using colored pencils or another technique, such as oil pastels or wax crayons. This hands-on work painting seminar seeks to connect the participating artist with the tradition and history of abstractionism beyond the pure expressive and intuitive pictorial exercise. We will create consistent abstract works deconstructing forms and creating narratives based on the symbol, the composition, and the application of pictorial material and color, resulting from the physical and mental experience of painting. We will use acrylic paint on canvas for this two-day immersive seminar. This seminar will consist of a pictorial process methodology that encourages participants to achieve small goals, step by step, from the general to the particular. Prior experience in acrylic painting is helpful but not required. Figurative painters welcome. For ages 15+.
